

## Tribun Health and France Biotech unveil 32 proposals to revolutionize digital pathology in France

July 8<sup>th</sup>, 2024 - Paris, France - The final report of the "Digital Pathology" task force, initiated by France Biotech and chaired by Jean-François Pomerol, CEO of Tribun Health, was presented at PariSanté Campus. For the first time, the entire industry - pathologists, manufacturers, and institutions - came together to work in close collaboration.

An unprecedented collaborative effort - The task force, composed of over 130 participants from diverse backgrounds - pathologists, manufacturers, institutions - worked for a year to define the challenges of a successful transition to digital pathology, encourage innovation, and strengthen the industry with structural and priority actions. The task force results thus provide a precise state of the benefits and challenges of the digital transformation of pathology through 32 actions to develop this excellence cluster in France.

An urgent need for digitization - Today, only 15% of the industry is digitized. Tribun Health is deeply committed to accelerating the digital transition of this specialty to improve public health management and meet the increasing demand for precise diagnoses.

Pathologists, key players in the fight against cancer, must have access to the best digital tools and AI. This revolution affects many aspects, from equipment financing to modernization, security, interoperability, regulations, and health professionals' training.T

**Key proposals -** To support this transition, the task force listed 32 priority actions, such as the need for adequate funding to digitize laboratories, the introduction of specific packages for digitization, as in radiology, support for DICOM and Ségur du Numérique initiatives, and improvement of training and integration of ethical and environmental concerns.

For Jean-François Pomerol, Chairman and CEO of Tribun Health and task force coordinator: "Anatomical pathology, a specialty essential for diagnosing diseases and fighting cancers, faces increasing activity despite stable medical demographics. In the era of precision medicine, we have never needed anatomical pathology as much as we do now, particularly in oncology. The industry is on the verge of a major and imperative digital transformation that requires public authorities' support to finance the investment costs of this transition and ensure excellence in patient care. To meet this challenge, the completion of this unprecedented task force bringing together the entire industry is a real lever aiming to make France a world leader through 32 priority actions. I thank all the contributors to this work and France Biotech for this unprecedented mobilization."
